



## Ring Automotive donates to charity eSports rally prize draw

Ben Buesnel, Jersey eRally event director, said: "We're delighted to have raised such important funds for our two charities. The event was a great success and we're really grateful to Ring for adding two brilliant prizes to the draw."

The draw offered various rally-related prizes, including autographed overalls from former European rally champion Chris Ingram, signed prints from rally legends Nicky Grist and Juha Kankunen, and world rally championship star Thierry Neuville, plus sim racing gloves and various branded rally merchandise.

The raffle raised over £1,000 for the two charities with Ring Automotive adding two of its MAGflex inspection lamps as prizes, including the MAGflex Slim 500, which offers 500 lumens of output and multi-angled light to shine where needed most.

Ring's contribution also included a MAGflex MINI 250, which features output of 250 lumens, with a robust housing to withstand tough working environments.
